How to Apply for Financial Aid

Step 1: Complete the 2025-2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid at www.fafsa.gov. You will need your 2023 Federal Tax Return, your FSA ID (<https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/sign-in/landing>), and Concordia's School Code (002541). Graduate students are considered independent for financial aid purposes.

Step 2: Review your Student Aid Report (SAR) for accuracy. You will receive this form 7-10 days after the FAFSA is submitted. If there are any errors on your SAR, log back into your FAFSA to make corrections.

Step 3: You will receive your financial aid award letter online from Concordia. This letter lists your financial aid eligibility. An email notification will be sent to your CUNE.ORG email account when it is ready to view and accept online. Be sure to contact the Financial Aid Office if you have any questions about your award.

Step 4: Complete Loan Entrance Counseling and the Master Promissory Note. Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note are only required for first time Federal Direct Loan borrowers. Both can be completed at www.studentloans.gov (you will need your PIN from Step 1).

- 1) File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- 6) Be enrolled at least half-time each term (3 credit hours)

The Federal (Title One) Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program:

If you and your school qualify, this program may provide loan forgiveness for eligible Federal Stafford Loans. This is a separate program requiring separate forms and processes. The U.S. Department of Education will determine your eligibility for this program; Concordia University, Nebraska is not responsible to verify your eligibility for this program. Please do not base your enrollment on this program, as it can be difficult to ensure qualification for government programs which are subject to reform and funding changes or limitations.

The TEACH Grant Program:

Current teachers who want to earn a Master of Education degree in Educational Administration with a Principal Endorsement. Depending on your teaching certificate, you can earn one of two administrative certificates after completing the 36-hour program: elementary administration (Pre-K-8) or secondary administration (7-12). You also have the option of completing the 45-hour dual (Pre-K-12) certification program.

What you learn:

Students will be introduced to the philosophy and practice of educational administration, to develop an understanding of the practices and principles of ethical school leadership to promote student success, and explore processes in administrative organization and the principals' role in teaching, leadership, and management.

How you learn:

Your file will be reviewed by the Director of Graduate Admission to determine your graduate school status, generally within 7-10 business days of your file becoming complete. Admission to graduate school depends on several factors including a completed application, cumulative GPA, transcripts, resume, and letter of intent (if applicable).

Transfer Credits

A maximum of 25% of program hours may be accepted by transfer from an appropriately approved and accredited institution. The courses must be equivalent to the student's approved sequence and must be recent (within the past seven years). Courses in which you received lower than a 3.0 (B) will not be considered for transfer. Upon recommendation from the Program Director and the Dean of the College of Graduate Studies, the Dean of the College of Education may accept additional coursework.
