*Internship I courses must be taken concurrently, MEDUC 506 and MEDUC 507 in the fall semester and MEDUC 512 and MEDUC 513 in the spring. Ten full days or 20 half days are required for field placement each semester.

**Internship II is to be taken in the following fall semester. This requirement involves full-time classroom experience. The concurrent courses are: MEDUC 518 and MEDUC 696.

All 500-level courses can be completed in the evenings except MEDUC 518. MEDUC 518 includes teaching obligations that can only be completed during the day. This requirement involves full-time classroom work and is completed in a partner school (fee applies).
